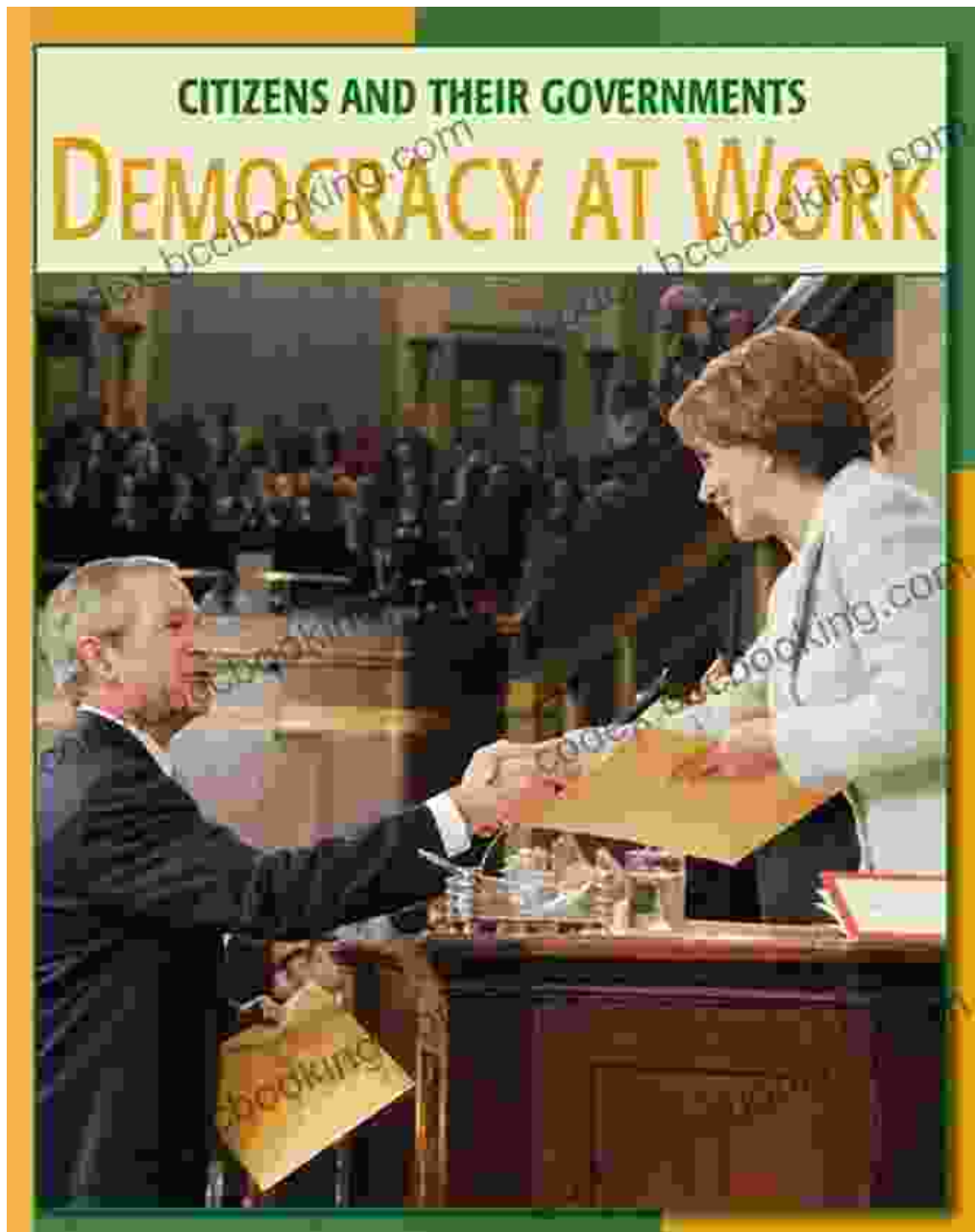


Democracy at Work: The Cure for Capitalism

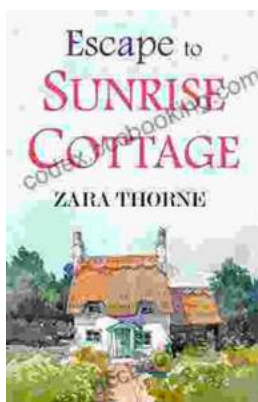

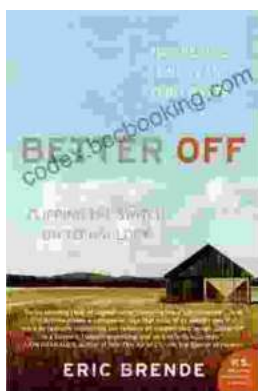
