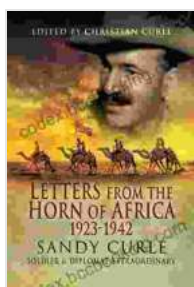


Sandy Curle: Soldier and Diplomat Extraordinary

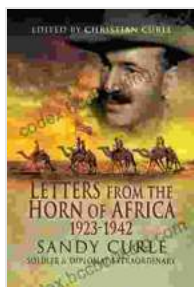

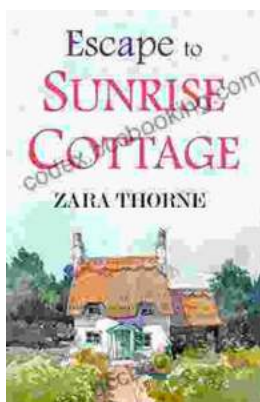
